



## 2013 Hernando y Sourdais La Hormiga de Antídoto

The 2013 La Hormiga de Antídoto is sourced from a single plot of vines north of the Duero, two kilometres north of the village of San Esteban de Gormaz on a slope with sandy soils and pure clay in the subsoil. This has a combination of modern and classical characteristics; they did a more traditional vinification here, and the aging was in 50% new barrels from Darnajou. The nose is not marked by the élevage, and it's clean and fresh, with some notes of evolution and incipient complexity: truffles and sous bois. Quite remarkable for such a young wine, with the elegant rusticity of the Riberas of yesteryear. The palate is medium to full-bodied, with some grainy tannins, some spices and a coarse texture akin to corduroy, which gives it its style and character. I have the feeling this should evolve beautifully in bottle. 6,000 bottles produced.
